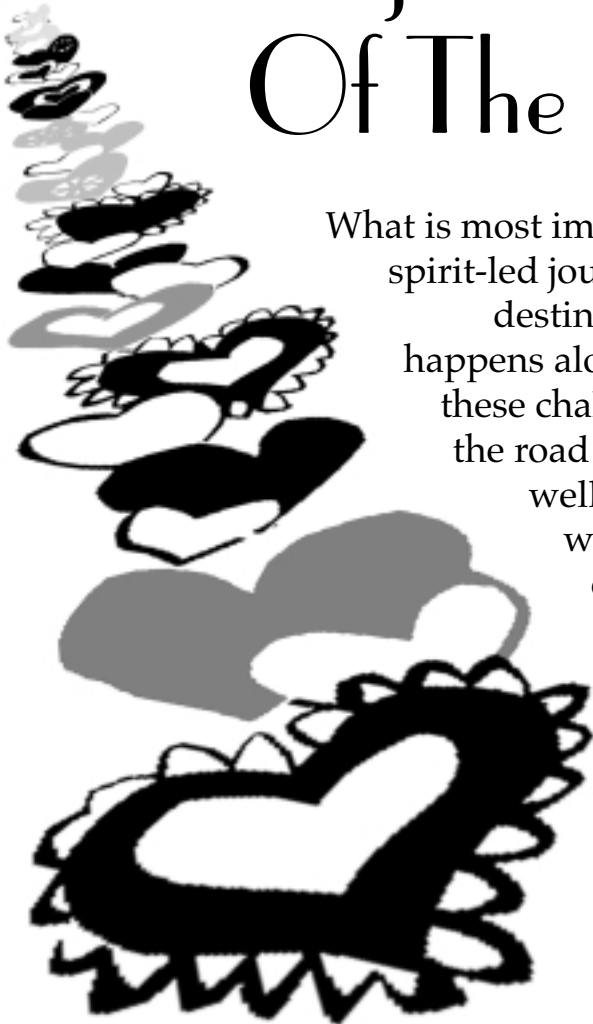


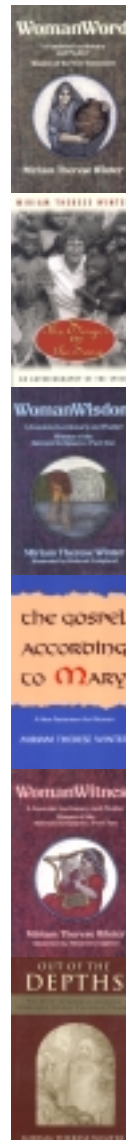

Miriam Therese Winter, MMS a Medical Mission Sister, is Professor of Liturgy, Worship, and Spirituality at Hartford Seminary, Hartford, CT. She holds a BA in Music, a MA in Religious Education and a PhD in Liturgical Studies from Princeton Theological Seminary.

She is an advocate nationally and internationally for an emerging feminist spirituality and for the full liberation of women, which she considers essential to ensuring the well-being of our planet and a necessary first step toward the liberation of all people. She is deeply committed to a vision of one world rooted in an understanding of the interconnectedness of all creation. Ecumenical, interfaith, and cross-cultural aspects of her multiple ministries have helped hone her cosmic worldview.

Traveling throughout the world witnessing to the work of the Spirit within us and among us, her programs and publications provide opportunities for people of all faith to explore unity within diversity and to embrace this as a gift from God.

Through talks and workshops, in prayer and in song, she addresses issues of justice and gender, peace and reconciliation, global inequity and our responsibility to reach out to those in need.

Miriam Therese has been writing and publishing Spirit-inspired songs since the Second Vatican Council—perhaps best known for *Joy Is Like the Rain*. She is the author of 13 books, including *Why Sing? Toward a Theology of Catholic Church Music*, *WomanPrayer*, *WomanSong: Resources for Ritual*, *The Gospel of Mary*, *Songlines*, *The Chronicles of Noah and Her Sisters*, and *The Singer and the Song* to name just a few. Her latest book which was published in 2001 is: *Out of the Depths: the Story of Ludmila Javorova, Ordained Roman Catholic Priest*.
